
DEATH OF HER MAJESTY, QUEEN ELIZABETH II PUBLIC HOLIDAY AND CUSTODY COURT ARRANGEMENTS

I, **AISHA YAQOOB ANWAR**, Sheriff Principal of the Sheriffdom of South Strathclyde, Dumfries and Galloway, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 28(1) of the Courts Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 and Section 8(2) and 8(3) of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995, do **HEREBY** prescribe:

- (a) Monday 19th September 2022 as a Court holiday in each of the sheriff and justice of the peace courts in the Sheriffdom of South Strathclyde, Dumfries and Galloway; and
- (b) that there will be a sitting on Saturday 17th September 2022 for the restricted purpose of the disposal of criminal business relative to persons who have been apprehended either under a warrant, in terms of section 135(3) of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 or at common law and detained in custody as follows:
 - (i) in Hamilton Sheriff Court if necessary, to deal with any person in custody in respect of criminal business emanating from Hamilton, Airdrie and Lanark Sheriff and Justice of the Peace Courts;
 - (ii) in Dumfries Sheriff Court if necessary, to deal with any person in custody in respect of criminal business emanating from Dumfries, Ayr or Stranraer Sheriff and Justice of the Peace Courts.

This Act of Court supersedes the Act of Court No 1 of 2021 dated 11 August 2021 but only insofar as the said Act of Court No 1 of 2021 sets out arrangements for custody business emanating from Ayr Sheriff Court on 19 September 2022.

I appoint this Order to be inserted into the Act Books in every court within the Sheriffdom, published on the Notice Board of each court within the Sheriffdom and on the Scottish Court and Tribunals website.
