The Cabinet Secretary in his response to the above PQ indicated that it related to operational matters within the responsibility of the Scottish Courts and Tribunals Service corporate body. I am now writing in response to the matter raised.

<u>S6W-12601</u> **Graham Simpson:** To ask the Scottish Government how many failures to comply with property factor enforcement orders have subsequently been complied with as a direct result of follow-up action taken by the Scottish Ministers in each of the last five years.

Decisions on whether a property factor enforcement order (PFEO) has been complied with is solely the responsibility of the First-tier Tribunal for Scotland (Housing and Property Chamber) (First-tier Tribunal). The First-tier Tribunal is an independent judicial body and is separate from the Scottish Government. Scottish Ministers therefore are unable to take direct action or have influence on whether a property factor complies with a PFEO.

<u>S6W-12602</u> **Graham Simpson:** To ask the Scottish Government how many times the police have been informed that a property factor has failed to comply with a property factor enforcement order in each of the last five years.

<u>S6W-12603</u> **Graham Simpson:** To ask the Scottish Government how many failures to comply with property factor enforcement orders have subsequently been complied with as a direct result of follow-up action taken by the police in each of the last five years.

This is information which we do not record. Failure to comply with a PFEO is a criminal office and therefore when referred to the police it becomes a matter for the Police to decide whether to report the crime to the procurator fiscal.
